

This factsheet provides information about the planned highways surveys taking place at Canvey Island.

What are we telling you about?

We are telling you about the upcoming highways surveys taking place on Canvey Island.

The surveys will be conducted by Ridge, and they will record the conditions of the highway network leading to the construction areas for our works. These works will renew and improve the erosion protection on the seaward face of the tidal defences, known as revetment. During the surveys, the team will take photographs to assess the current highway conditions.

They will cover the following areas:

- The Thorney Bay Road south of and including from the vehicular maintenance access to The Wooden Park only
- Western Esplanade; Furtherwick Road between Eastern Esplanade and Western Esplanade only
- Eastern Esplanade and Marine Parade
- The main compound location, eastern end of Eastern Esplanade, south of Athol Close
- Satellite compound 1, south of Western Esplanade
- Materials storage area, north-eastern corner of Wooden Park, Thorney Bay

The surveys will be carried out on foot from the existing pavement and will not impact traffic flow. They will also be non-intrusive and will not create any additional noise and do not require any digging.

Why are we doing this work?

The Canvey Island southern shoreline revetment project will maintain the existing high level of tidal flood risk protection to thousands of homes, businesses, and infrastructure on Canvey Island into the future. Further details can be found at this website:
