Progress from site

Over the past month we have:

- Continued to remove temporary haul road - Eastern Esplanade phase.
- Continued to remove temporary haul road - Concord Beach phase.
- Opened up Concord Beach for public use.

In the coming weeks, we will:

- Complete demobilising of the satellite compound located in the car park opposite the MovieStarr.
- Open up a further section of Concord Beach, including the Eastern Tidal Pool.
- Continue with the removal of the temporary haul road in both the Eastern Esplanade and Concord Beach phases.
- Continue with the new tarmac path on the landward side of the river wall in both the Eastern Esplanade and Concord Beach phases.

Thorney Bay
All works complete and full public access

Labworth Café
All works complete and full public access

Concord Beach
The Western Tidal Pool, along with Concord Café, is set to open in June 2025.
Our goal is to finish the entire area, including the Eastern Tidal Pool, before the summer holiday season.

Eastern Esplanade
Works ongoing, closed until September 2025

Leigh Beck
All works complete and full public access

Chapman Sands
Small section of Marine Parade Haul Road required until completion of works.

Concord Beach phase

Riverside revetment works
September 2024 - June 2025
Landside reinstatement – July 2025

Chapman Sands phase

Riverside revetment works
November 2023 - Winter 2024
Landside reinstatement – Spring 2025

Eastern Esplanade phase

Riverside revetment works
March 2024 - June 2025
Landside reinstatement- September 2025

This updated timeline outlines the current work phases for the project. We are pleased to confirm that we are currently on track to finish the work on the embankments by this summer.

We are currently demobilising compound 2, opposite the MovieStarr, and are due to vacate this area fully by the summer. We are also continuing to remove the temporary haul roads for the Eastern Esplanade and Concord Beach phases.

Reinstatement of landward slopes

As we come to the end of the project, our project team will continue to carry out reinstatement of the landward slopes.

We have selected a grass seed mix which contains a floral species mixed with grass species which are both suitable for being mown to a short height.

To allow the grass seed mix to grow, we will place chestnut fencing around the area, which will be removed once the area has had the opportunity for full growth. The grass plays an important role in the stability of the embankment, and we must allow a good grass root growth before we can allow access to the public
