

Canvey Island Southern Shoreline Revetment Replacement Scheme: Local resident engagement

What are we telling you about?

We are writing to let you know about a series of virtual meetings that local residents have been invited to attend. These sessions will introduce the project itself as well as giving specific detail on the location and duration of the proposed site compounds needed to ensure delivery of this vital flood risk management project.

Where is this happening?

Residents identified as living close to one of the proposed compound locations shown on the map overleaf have been written to with an accompanying leaflet – appended to this factsheet.

When is this happening?

A series of virtual meetings are planned to take place between 6-8pm Monday to Thursday across w/c 20 and 27 September. Residents are invited to join a session specific to the proposed compound closest to their property – one session will be held each week per compound location.

What is the impact of the work?

We anticipate that the main compound will be required for the complete duration of the entire project – at least two years. The other compounds, known as “satellite” compounds will only be required when work is planned along the given section of the southern shoreline. Therefore, these compounds are planned to be operational for a much shorter duration than the main compound, 6-8 months as broad estimate at this stage.

For construction activities outside of the tidal area, works will be carried out during normal working hours, i.e. 8am – 6pm.

For works influenced by the tide, such as placing the new revetment, construction activities need to be maximise an approximate 5 hour working window.

We propose to extend the working hours for tidal works from 6am – 10pm. However, we will only be working the low tide window during these hours and not the full period, i.e. if we started at 6am then we would finish that shift at 11am.

Why are we doing this?

We are holding this initial consultation with targeted residents to introduce them to the scheme, outline how we propose to deliver the scheme and the steps we are taking to minimise impacts upon the local community. We welcome feedback to the proposed means of delivering the project. This will help shape our planning permission application for these proposed compounds planned for later this calendar year – a matter we have discussed with Castle Point Borough Council's planning officers.
